IV. PROGRAM/CURRICULUM

BOARD ACTION

A. <u>Good News in Our Schools</u>

- The <u>kindergarten</u> children learned about New Year's Resolutions. Each student chose a goal and will try to stick to it throughout the year. Also, we are learning about our five senses. Students are learning firsthand how each of our senses helps us to learn about the world around us.
- The <u>first graders</u> have explored the smartboard and mimio technology to read information text about Penguins. We discussed the different types of penguins, their locations, features, and life cycles. In addition, the students read an informational piece from "Scholastic News" about penguin chicks.
- The <u>second grade</u> students are working on a report, "Heart of the Matter," based on a novel that is appropriate to reading levels. The second grade teachers recently increased homework to include open-ended responses to reading, to deepen comprehension & develop written response quality.
- <u>Grade three</u> teachers administered the mid-year on-demand writing prompt in NJ ASK format. Student responses were scored according to the NJ Holistic Scoring Rubric with Dr. T and Dr. C. Teachers are currently in the process of individually conferencing with students to give them feedback and strategies to improve their writing.
- <u>Grade level teams</u> met this month to discuss instructional changes made to adjust to Common Core Standards during the first half of the school year. Teams discussed changes and looked for patterns/gaps (K -3). Instruction is currently being adjusted for the second half of the year based upon information gained.

- <u>Stevenson School Student Council</u> organized a Math-A-Thon to raise money for St. Jude's Children's Hospital. We will kick off the event with a school wide assembly on January 30th. An article describing the Math-A-Thon appeared in The Progress on January 16th.
- <u>Students at Churchill</u> began the "Superbowl of Reading" program which challenges students to read a minimum of 20 minutes per night in an area of personal interest. After one week, the students had read thousands of minutes per homeroom!
- <u>Grade 4</u> students have now begun the ACHIEVE 3000 program and are excited about building their non-fiction reading skills by reading articles, completing activities and earning points for completed work online.
- <u>Grade 5</u> students have been using the ACHIEVE 3000 program twice a week during the school day at Churchill. The program differentiates reading so that complex informational articles are at the appropriate reading level of each student. As a result, the reading scores of our students are improving. 70% of students have increased their reading scores and many are already at the "target end of the year mark" for reading.
- Students in grade 6 are:
 - working with Officer Lou on issues related to "peer pressure" and "better communication skills,". The classes are part of the "Too Good" program, which replaced the D.A.R.E. program last year. Students attend these classes once a week.
 - working on argumentative writing where they are learning that, even at a young age, they can have a "voice" in their writing. Students are learning to fight for or against what they truly believe in while examining both sides of the argument.
 - experiencing a real life example of math. Students are taking a recipe and making calculations to double and triple the recipe. The ingredients contain fractional amounts, and they need to perform their calculations accurately.
- Students in grades 4- 6 "participated in "No-Name Calling Week" the week of January 20. Students in grade 4 filled buckets with compliments for others. In grade 5, students made a graffiti wall with compliments for others and in grade 6, students produced "All About Me" projects which allowed them to express unique and positive characteristics about themselves. Teachers commented that the activities really promoted positive behaviors within the students.
