I. Maximum Travel

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3, a board of education must establish a maximum dollar limit for travel expenditure, as defined in N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.1 et seq.,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Fairfield Board of Education includes in the tentative budget a maximum travel expenditure in the amount of \$22,600 for the 2022-2023 school year. The maximum travel expenditure amount for the 2021-2022 school year is \$17,100, of which \$3,170 has been paid to date.

J. <u>Travel and Related Expense Reimbursement 2022-2023</u>

WHEREAS, the Fairfield Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A Subchapter 7 requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, a board of education may establish, for regular district business travel only, an annual school year threshold of \$150 per staff member where prior Board approval shall not be required unless this annual threshold for a staff member is exceeded in a given school year (July 1 through June 30); and

WHEREAS, travel and related expenses not in compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A Subchapter 7 but deemed by the board of education to be necessary and unavoidable as noted on the approved Board of Education Out-of-District Travel and Reimbursement Forms;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Fairfield Board of Education approves all travel not in compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A Subchapter 7 as being necessary and unavoidable as noted on the approved Board of Education Out-of-District Travel and Reimbursement Forms; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fairfield Board of Education includes in the tentative budget travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A Subchapter 7 to a maximum expenditure of \$22,600 for all staff and Board members for the 2022-2023 school year.

The School Business Administrator/Board Secretary shall track and record these costs to ensure that the maximum amount is not exceeded.

K. Maximum Professional Services

M. Acquisition and Installation of Temporary Classroom Units

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FAIRFIELD IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY authorizing the solicitation of quotes for a tax-exempt lease purchase financing to finance a portion of the cost of the acquisition and installation of two temporary classroom units at Churchill School, delegating the award to the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary and authorizing the execution of a lease purchase financing;

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Township of Fairfield in the County of Essex, New Jersey (the "Board") seeks to acquire and to install two (2) temporary classroom units at the Churchill School, including the acquisition of any related equipment, upgrades and any site improvements (collectively, the "Equipment"); and

WHEREAS, the total cost of the Equipment is expected to not exceed \$650,000;

WHEREAS, the Board may use up to \$408,000 from either currently budgeted funds and/or funds available in its capital reserve account to offset a portion of the cost of the Equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Board intends to finance the balance of the cost of the Equipment through a tax-exempt lease purchase financing in an amount not to exceed \$242,000 (the "Lease Purchase Financing"); and

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to solicit quotes (hereinafter "Quotes"), for such Lease Purchase Financing, to delegate the award of the financing to the Business Administrator/Board Secretary and to authorize the entering into such Lease Purchase Financing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FAIRFIELD IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Board hereby approves and directs Phoenix Advisors, LLC (the "Municipal Advisor") and Wilentz, Goldman & Spitzer ("Bond Counsel") to solicit Quotes, on behalf of the Board in order to finance a portion of the costs, as set forth above, of the Equipment through a tax-exempt Lease Purchase in an amount not to exceed \$242,000.

SECTION 2. The Board reasonably expects to reimburse itself from the proceeds of the Lease Purchase Financing for certain costs of the Equipment paid prior to the execution and delivery of the Lease Purchase Financing from sources other than the Lease Purchase Financing which have been or are reasonably expected to be reserved, allocated on a long-term basis or have otherwise been set aside by the Board, pursuant to its budget or financial policies with respect to any expenditures to be reimbursed. This Section 2 is intended to be and hereby is a declaration of the Board's official intent to reimburse any expenditures toward certain costs of the Equipment to be incurred and paid prior to the execution and delivery of the Lease Purchase Financing in accordance with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2, and no further action (or inaction) will be an abusive arbitrage device in accordance with Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-10 to avoid, in whole or in part, arbitrage yield restrictions or arbitrage rebate requirements under section 148 of the Code. The proceeds of the Lease Purchase Financing used to reimburse the Board for any expenditures toward certain costs of the Equipment will not be used directly or indirectly (i) to "refund" an issue of governmental obligations within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-1(d), (ii) to create or increase the balance in "replacement proceeds", within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-1 of the Lease Purchase Financing, or any other agreement, with respect to any obligation of the Board or to replace funds, or (iii) to reimburse the Board for any expenditure or payment that was originally paid with the proceeds of any obligation of The Lease Purchase Financing used to reimburse the Board for any expenditure toward certain costs of the Equipment, as described above, will be issued in an amount not to exceed \$242,000. The costs to be reimbursed with the proceeds of the Lease Purchase Financing will be "capital expenditures" in accordance with the meaning of section 150 of the Code and Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-1. This Section 2 shall take effect immediately, but will be of no effect with regard to expenditures for costs paid outside the permitted reimbursement period set forth in Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2(d)(2).

SECTION 3. Upon receipt of the Quotes and the analysis thereof, the Business Administrator/Board Secretary, is authorized to award the Lease Purchase Financing to the lessor that proposed the most economically advantageous proposal to the Board based upon the advice and recommendation of the Municipal Advisor. The term of the Lease shall not exceed five (5) years. In consultation with Bond Counsel and the Municipal Advisor, the Board President, the Board Vice President, the Superintendent and/or the Business Administrator/Board Secretary are each hereby authorized and directed to execute all documents including, but not limited to, a lease purchase agreement, an escrow agreement, as applicable, and all closing documents in connection with the Lease Purchase and are hereby authorized to take any other action necessary therefor or incidental thereto. The execution by such officials and officers of any such documents, with changes, insertions or omissions approved by the Business Administrator/Board Secretary, in consultation with Bond Counsel, as hereinabove provided, shall be conclusive and no further ratification or other action by the Board shall be required with respect thereto.

SECTION 4. The Board hereby covenants that it will comply with any conditions subsequently imposed by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), in order to preserve the exemption from taxation of interest on the Lease Purchase Financing, including, if necessary, the requirement to rebate all net investment earnings on the gross proceeds above the yield on the Lease Purchase Financing. The Lease Purchase Financing will be designated as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" for purposes of section 265(b)(3)(B)(ii) of the Code.

SECTION 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

N. Appointment of Special Counsel

BE IT RESOLVED that the Fairfield Board of Education appoints Suzanne Marasco, Esq. of Hill Wallack LLP to represent the Board at an hourly rate of \$200 for Special Counsel regarding a pending legal matter.

O. Engagement of Phoenix Advisors for Lease Purchase Financing

BE IT RESOLVED that the Fairfield Board of Education appoints Phoenix Advisors to facilitate the financing for equipment and capital projects using lease purchase financing at a proposed compensation rate of \$0.25 per \$1,000 issued (per transaction minimum fee \$2,500) for a term to remain in effect until the completion of assignment.
