

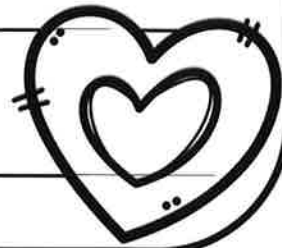

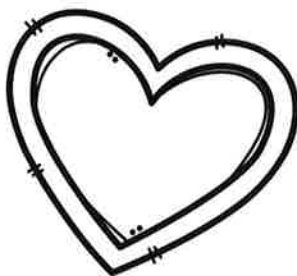

- Call someone on the phone and say "Hello, how are you today?"



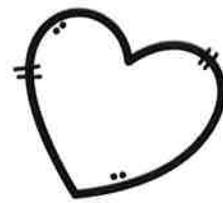
