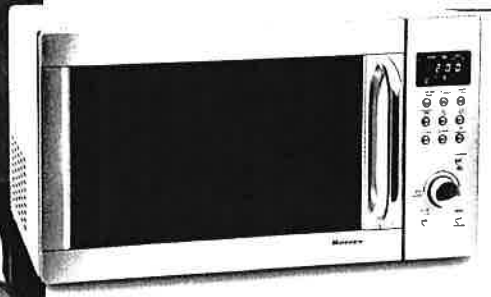
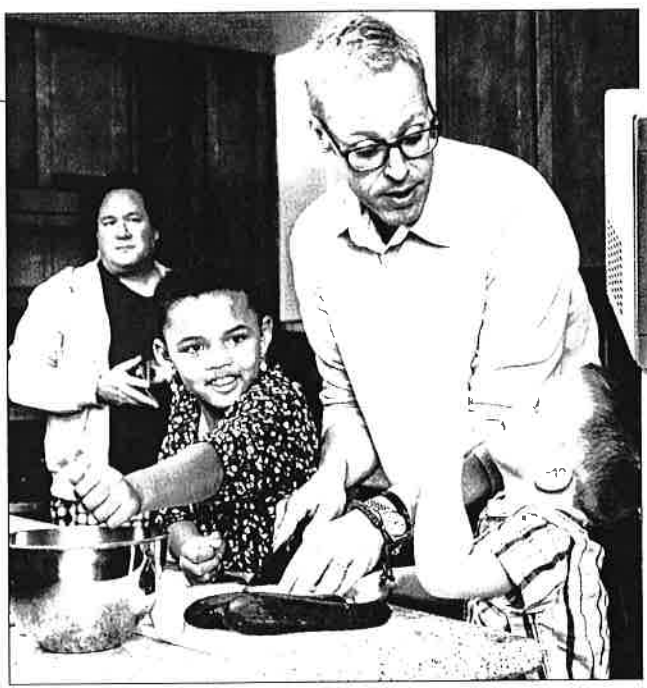
People made their own cloth. They spun their own yarn. They sewed their own clothes. People cooked food in a fireplace.
